In February we saw the promotion of Dan McGee from Lieutenant to Chief of Police. Chief McGee has done a lot of new things for the department so far which you will find highlighted below in this section.

In May we saw the promotion of Darrell Higbie from Sergeant to Lieutenant and we are excited to see the things that Lt. Higbie can accomplish with his new promotion.



To finish highlighting our newly painted walls we added "Montpelier Police Department" to the wall behind the Administrative Specialist's desk, as a little welcome to all that visit us at the department.

In 2013 we purchased the new Ford Sport Utility Vehicle police interceptor. We also have changed the color to a dark navy blue. Also purchased and voted on by members of the department were new graphics for the side of our cruisers and we continue to be overwhelmed by positive comments about the new look.

Also in 2013 we added more officers to our Reserves. We went from a Reserve Unit with only 4 officers to 10 officers. This is a helpful addition to the department in having more officers available to assist with parades, riding with officers, and any extra help where needed.

At the October 14, 2013 Council Meeting we saw a new ordinance passed (513.15). This ordinance is one that has been addressed in many communities in the Northwest Ohio area this past year. The ordinance is "Prohibition On The Manufacture, Sale, Distribution And Possession Of Synthetic Drugs And Synthetic Drug Lookalike Substances." With the support of the entire department, who were present at the council meeting, we saw a community come together and stand up in the fight against a drug that was affecting our community.

Due to the generosity and support of Charlie and Norma Clymer showed to our department. Chief McGee was able to put together an *Honor Wall* on the north wall of the patrol area in the department. This wall has a display of what the Montpelier Police Department stands for; **Honor, Courage, Dignity, Loyalty, Respect, and Integrity.** We have also added our patch display to this wall of all the patches of fellow departments from our county, state, nation, and around the world. This wall is something we are proud of and know that Charlie and Norma would approve of. Charlie and Norma are the grandparents of Sgt.
