## **REFLECTION 2022**

While we hope this will make work life more convenient for the officers, it will have it's biggest impact once our Spillman project is complete. With this new RMS and the MDTs, officers will be fully functional in our cars, from starting calls, to researching call information, completing reports, and eventually using LEADS.

In November we held our annual No Shave Montpelier event, raising money through donations. This year we focused our efforts for Meredith Cluckey, the daughter of RCpl. Duaine Cluckey. Meredith is battling Langerhans Cell Histiocytosis (LCH). Officers paid a fine to break policy and grow beards for the entire month of November! # A.L.E.R.T. TEAM


