VILLAGE OF MONTPELIER COUNCIL MEETING

MONTPELIER, OHIO

MONDAY, JANUARY 12, 2026

Call to Order	Mayor Steve Yagelski called the Montpelier Village Council's regular meeting to order at 6:00 pm on Monday, January 12, 2026.
	Clerk of Council Molly Collert administered the Oath of Office to council members Ms. Melissa Ewers, Mr. Kevin Motter, and Mrs. Heather Freese.
Roll Call	A roll call was conducted, and the following Council members were present: Mr. Kevin Motter, Mr. Nathan Thompson, Mrs. Heather Freese, Mr. Don Schlosser, Mr. Chris Kannel, and Ms. Melissa Ewers.
Moment of Silence/Pledge	Pastor Jan Desterhaft offered a prayer, followed by those in attendance reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.
Agenda 01/12/2026	Mrs. Heather Freese moved, and Mr. Don Schlosser seconded a motion to approve the agenda for January 12, 2026. Vote on motion: All ayes
Minutes 12/15/2025	Mr. Kevin Motter moved, and Ms. Melissa Ewers seconded a motion to approve the minutes from the December 15, 2025, meeting. Vote on motion: All ayes
Approve December 2025 Financials	Mrs. Heather Freese moved, and Mr. Chris Kannel seconded a motion to approve the December 2025 Financials. Vote on motion: All ayes
Welcome	Mayor Steve Yagelski welcomed the media and the public to the meeting and welcomed attendees to ask questions.
Council Comments	There were no committee or council reports.
Tim Bok: Present Stage One Design and Timeline for Wabash Cannonball Trail	Tim Bok of OHM reported that the OHM design team met with Justin Houk and Jason Rockey to review several design elements. The preliminary design will be submitted to ODOT this Friday. Stage One establishes the project's line and grade and identifies construction limits, which will allow for environmental review and the preparation of right-of-way plans. Potential right-of-way acquisitions may be required at the end of County Road 13. The current construction cost estimate is \$4,034,063.00, which is below the budgeted construction estimate of \$5,090,850.00. The original budget included several sections of boardwalk; however, boardwalks will not be necessary based on the preliminary design. The project's construction target year is 2029, with \$4.4 million in funding from ODOT. Stage Two of the project is expected to begin this summer. Tim Bok noted that ODOT requires the trail to be 11 feet wide. Mr. Nathan Thompson asked whether this requirement would pose any issues. Tim Bok responded that most of the project work will involve trail clearing. OHM is coordinating with the administration to determine appropriate maintenance vehicle types and the required asphalt thickness. Ms. Melissa Ewers asked whether trees would be preserved to provide shaded areas. Mr. Bok stated that OHM intends to minimize tree removal and avoid cutting back trees more than necessary.



**Jefferson
Township Trustees
to Discuss 2026
Fire Contract**

Austin Poynter and Brian Batterson, of the Jefferson Township Trustees, joined the council to discuss the 2026 Fire contract that the Village provides to the township. Austin Poynter would like clarification on the current contract. Jefferson Township has four fire departments: Bryan, Brady, Kunkle, and Montpelier. Brady and Bryan are comparable in size to the service area. The area that Montpelier services has the most runs, but not always. Jefferson Township has a fire levy of \$50,000.00, and Montpelier's contract is just under \$50,000.00. Jefferson Township pays for the other three departments out of the general fund. Both Brady and Bryan are at \$12,000.00 per year, and Kunkle is at \$ 2,400.00. The trustees would like the council to examine the contract formula and ask how long it has been in place. Jefferson would also like to know how many runs actually go to Holiday City. The next option is to go to the taxpayers for a new levy, and there is always a possibility that it could fail. Montpelier is \$1900.00 a run, and other departments are \$850.00 a run. Austin Poynter stated that the township is happy with the service, and the department has a great response time. Mayor Steve Yagelski asked when the township last asked for a fire levy increase. Austin Poynter stated that it was renewed in the previous year. The township's fire levy is at its max. The formula has been in place for at least 30 years. Mayor Steve Yagelski stated that other townships do not question the formula. Mayor Steve Yagelski stated that the coverage includes the turnpike, which has many accidents. Mayor Steve Yagelski also stated that it is a municipality in Jefferson Township and does not have a fire department, and asked if the township has asked them to help cover costs. Jefferson Township plans to have a meeting with Holiday City. Jefferson Township will look up the runs that go into Holiday City. Jefferson Township would only expect Holiday City to pay for the runs made in Holiday City. Nikki Uribes stated that the formula is based on a five-year average actual fire department budget minus 10%, and the total runs and the runs the township has. Mr. Chris Kannel asked what Bryan based their price on. Austin Poynter stated that he was not sure how Bryan or Brady Township calculated their runs. Mr. Chris Kannel stated that before the council asks the administration to review the calculation, Jefferson Township should find out how Brady and Bryan arrive at the cost per run. Austin Poynter expressed concerns over going to the voters for a fire levy. Mr. Chris Kannel stated that Montpelier Village understands the situation, as the Village recently passed a fire and police levy because expenses exceeded revenue. Mr. Chris Kannel stated that he would not support any more work on the formula until Jefferson Township knows how the other fire departments calculate the cost per run. Mayor Steve Yagelski thanked the township trustees for attending the meeting. Jefferson Township is thankful for the Montpelier Fire Department and invited the council members to attend the township meetings.

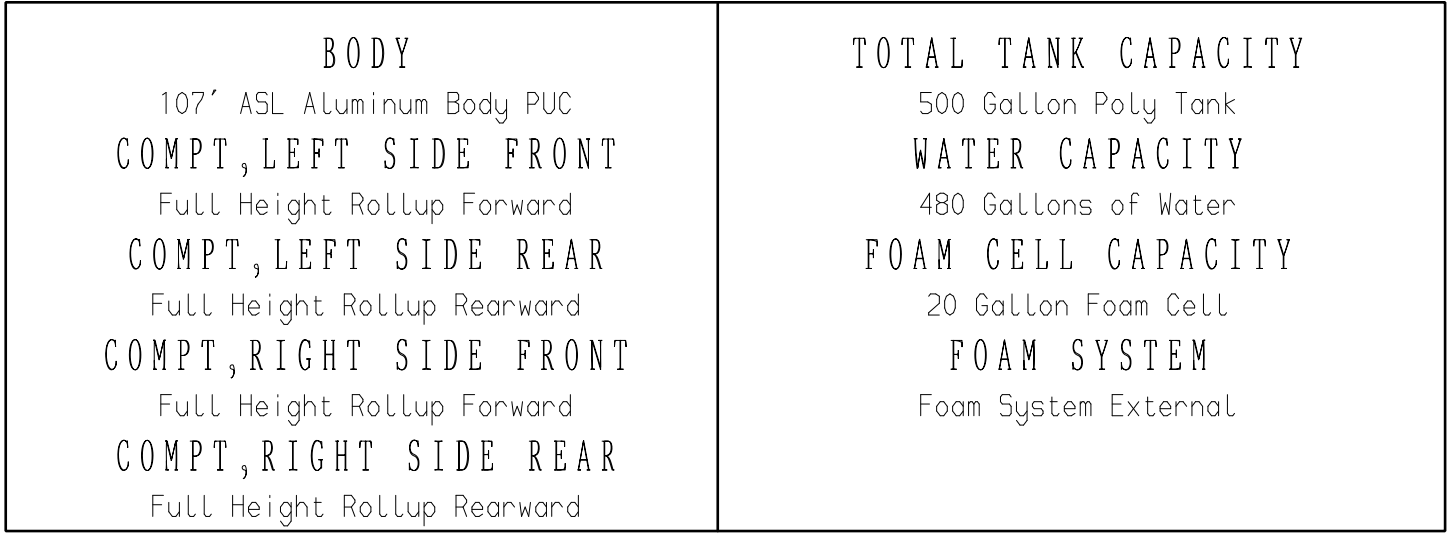

ORDINANCE NO. 2291

AN ORDINANCE TO APPROVE, ADOPT AND ENACT THE 2025 CODIFIED ORDINANCES; TO REPEAL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH; A NOTICE OF THE ENACTMENT OF NEW MATTERS.

Be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Montpelier, that:

Section 1: The Mayor and the Clerk of Council have certified as correct the book form of the 2008 Codified Ordinances to the Council.

Section 2: The Ordinances of Montpelier of a general and permanent nature, as revised, codified, rearranged and consolidated into component codes, titles, chapters and sections, and placed in book form, are hereby approved, adopted and enacted as the Codified Ordinances of Montpelier, Ohio, 2025.

Section 3: The provisions of this Ordinance, including all provisions of the Codified Ordinances, shall be in full force and effect immediately upon passage of this Ordinance. All Ordinances or parts thereof enacted prior to December 31, 2025, which are inconsistent with any provisions of the Codified Ordinances, are hereby repealed as of the effective date of this Ordinance, except as follows:

- (a) The enactment of the Codified Ordinances shall not be construed to affect a right or liability accrued or incurred under any legislative provisions prior to the effective date of such enactment, or an action or proceeding for the enforcement of such right or liability. Such enactment shall not be construed to relieve any person from punishment for an act committed in violation of any such legislative provisions, nor to affect an indictment or prosecution therefor. For such purposes, any such legislative provision shall continue in full force notwithstanding its repeal for the purpose of revision and recodification.
- (b) The repeal provided above shall not affect:
 - (1) The grant or creation of a franchise, license, right, easement or privilege.
 - (2) The purchase, sale, lease or transfer of property.
 - (3) The appropriation or expenditure of money or promise or guarantee of payment.
 - (4) The assumption of any contract or obligation.
 - (5) The issuance and delivery of any bond, obligations or other instruments of indebtedness.
 - (6) The levy or imposition of taxes, assessments or charges.
 - (7) The establishment, naming, vacating or grade level of any street or public way.
 - (8) The dedication of property or plat approval.
 - (9) The annexation or detachment of territory.
 - (10) Any legislation enacted subsequent to December 31, 2025.

Section 4: The term “Ordinance(s)” or “ordinance(s)” used herein shall include “Resolution(s)” and “resolution(s)”.

Section 5: The Clerk shall publish a notice of the enactment of this codifying ordinance which notice shall contain the title of the ordinance and the following:

Report from the Chief's Desk

The Montpelier Fire Department continues to make measurable progress in strengthening emergency services for the Village through strategic planning, community investment, and regional cooperation. This report highlights recent achievements, including improved fire protection classification and voter support for critical apparatus replacement, while also outlining future priorities related to apparatus lifecycle planning, training infrastructure, and firefighter compensation. Together, these efforts reflect a commitment to maintaining reliable, effective, and sustainable fire protection for the community.

Over the past year, the Montpelier Fire Department achieved significant milestones that reflect the collective efforts of firefighters, Village leadership, and the community as a whole. Most notably, the department attained an ISO Class 3 rating, placing Montpelier among a small percentage of communities nationwide with this level of fire protection. This improvement is the result of years of coordinated work involving training, apparatus readiness, water supply, communications, and administrative support across multiple Village departments.

In addition, Village voters approved a 10-year earned income tax levy dedicated to the replacement of the department's ladder truck. This investment will allow the department to replace Ladder 68, which was originally placed into service in 1995, and ensures that critical aerial and fireground capabilities remain available for decades to come. These accomplishments demonstrate what can be achieved when long-term planning is paired with strong community support.

While the passage of the levy for the ladder truck represents a major step forward, it is important to recognize that much of the department's apparatus fleet continues to age. Fire apparatus are long-term capital investments that require planning well in advance of replacement to avoid service interruptions and unplanned expenses.

Based on current fleet conditions and industry service-life standards, the department anticipates the need to order a replacement apparatus in 2029, with an estimated delivery in 2031. This apparatus is intended to replace both Engine 67 and Rescue 63. In 2031, Rescue 63 will be 38 years old and Engine 67 will be 31 years old, well beyond the typical service life for frontline emergency vehicles.

This planned replacement would reduce the total number of frontline apparatus by one while improving overall operational effectiveness, safety, and response flexibility by combining capabilities into a single modern unit. To support this purchase, the Village will need to plan for approximately \$1.3 million in available funding, based on current trends in apparatus pricing. Beginning this discussion early allows for thoughtful capital planning and avoids emergency replacement driven by equipment failure.

The year 2031 will also mark the 150th anniversary of the Montpelier Fire Department, making this future apparatus a meaningful symbol of both the department's history and its continued commitment to serving the community.

As operational demands and training expectations continue to grow, the need for dedicated space to support firefighter training and equipment storage has become increasingly important. One potential opportunity is the future availability of the Village-owned property at 201 West Court Street, which is currently utilized by the Village's water distribution department. Should that department be able to expand its existing facilities, this site may become available for alternate municipal use.

If repurposed for fire department use, the property could provide secure storage for specialized equipment and serve as an indoor training area. Indoor training space allows firefighters to train consistently throughout the year, regardless of weather conditions, and supports regular instruction in core skills such as search and rescue, hose line deployment, forcible entry, victim removal, and rapid intervention techniques.

Consistent, documented training is a critical component of maintaining the department's ISO Class 3 rating. A dedicated training facility strengthens the department's ability to meet these expectations while enhancing firefighter safety and operational readiness.

Looking ahead, the department intends to pursue the installation of an NFPA 1402-compliant training structure on the fire station campus by 2028, at an estimated cost of approximately \$250,000. This purpose-built structure would provide realistic and repeatable training opportunities, including roof simulations, ground and aerial ladder placement, confined space and reduced-profile rescue, hose advancement, and search operations. A permanent training structure offers long-term value by reducing liability, ensuring availability, and supporting regional training opportunities with neighboring departments.

The Montpelier Fire Department is fortunate to be able to compensate its firefighters for emergency response and training. This compensation has been helpful in maintaining staffing levels and operational readiness as well as appreciated by the firefighters.

Currently, a new firefighter earns \$8.80 per hour, a Firefighter I earns \$10.75 per hour, and a Firefighter II earns \$12.00 per hour. All firefighters are compensated at a rate of \$9.50 for each two-hour training session they attend. In 2026, the minimum wage in the State of Ohio has increased to \$11.00 per hour. As a result, portions of the current pay structure fall below the minimum wage rate for other forms of employment.

As Fire Chief, I am requesting that firefighter wages be reexamined for 2027. The volunteer fire service continues to face challenges nationwide in attracting and retaining members, particularly as training requirements, time commitments, and operational risks increase. Competitive and transparent compensation is one of several tools available to encourage individuals to consider service in the fire department.

I intend to develop a proposal outlining potential pay structure adjustments, fiscal impacts, and implementation options for consideration by August of 2026, unless requested earlier by Village leadership. Establishing this timeline allows for thoughtful review and coordination with the Village's budgeting and long-term planning processes.

Ensuring that firefighter compensation reflects both the responsibilities of the role and current economic conditions is an investment in staffing stability, response capability, and public safety.

Strategic Planning Summary (2025–2031)

Recent Achievements

- Achieved ISO Class 3 fire protection rating through coordinated efforts involving firefighters, Village administration, water distribution, communications, and community investment.
- Voter approval of a 10-year earned income tax levy to replace Ladder 68, originally placed in service in 1995.

Apparatus Planning & Fleet Sustainability

The department plans to order a combined Engine/Rescue apparatus in 2029 with an estimated delivery in 2031. This apparatus will replace Engine 67 and Rescue 63, which will be 31 and 38 years old respectively in 2031. The estimated funding requirement is approximately \$1.3 million. This replacement will reduce the fleet by one apparatus while improving operational effectiveness and safety. The delivery year coincides with the 150th anniversary of the Montpelier Fire Department.

Facilities & Training Readiness

The Village-owned property at 201 West Court Street may become available for repurposing should the water distribution department expand its facilities. If available, this site could support equipment storage and indoor, year-round firefighter training. Maintaining consistent training is vital to sustaining the department's ISO Class 3 rating.

In addition, the department intends to pursue the installation of an NFPA 1402–compliant training structure on the fire station campus by 2028, at an estimated cost of \$250,000. This structure would support roof simulations, ladder placement, confined space rescue, hose advancement, and search operations.

Firefighter Staffing & Compensation

Current firefighter pay ranges from \$8.80 to \$12.00 per hour depending on certification level, with training paid at \$9.50 per two-hour session. With the Ohio minimum wage increasing to \$11.00 per hour in 2026, the Fire Chief is requesting a reexamination of firefighter compensation for 2027. A proposal outlining recommended pay structure adjustments and fiscal impacts will be prepared for consideration by August 2026.

Key Takeaway

Early planning for apparatus replacement, facilities, training infrastructure, and firefighter compensation allows the Village to avoid emergency spending, maintain ISO Class 3 fire protection, support firefighter safety, and sustain reliable emergency services for the community.

Below is a listing of the Montpelier Fire Department's Apparatus. The replacement of fire apparatus is a decision which is not entered into lightly. There is a considerable monetary investment in each apparatus that is purchased. The Montpelier Fire Department has always been a good steward of its apparatus and does all it can to ensure that these vehicles are maintained and kept clean and in good working order. The fire department greatly appreciates the efforts and skills of Chris Hinkle, village mechanic, in keeping these vehicles well maintained.

Although we were able to pass our levy to replace Ladder 68, this does not remove the need to start planning for the replacement of Engine 67 and Rescue 63. The village will not see the new Ladder 68 before 2029. Our apparatus will continue to age and we must look at ordering the replacement for Engine 67 and 63 by 2029. This would mean a possible delivery in 2031. At that time Rescue 63 will be 38 years old and Engine 67 will be 31 years old. I would ask council to start making plans to have at least 1.3 million dollars available by 2031 for the purchase of an apparatus that will be able to replace both Engine 67 and Rescue 63. This will reduce our fleet of apparatus by one, but make the fire department more effective in our response.

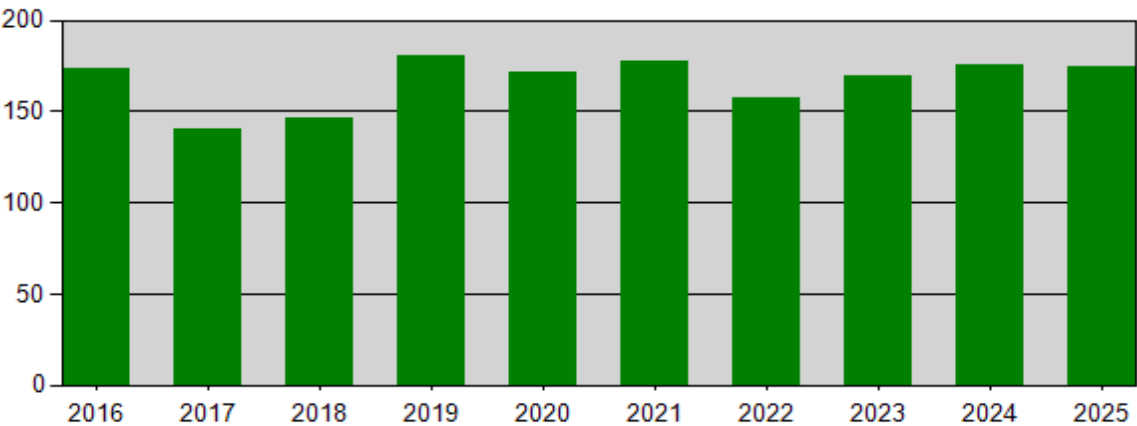

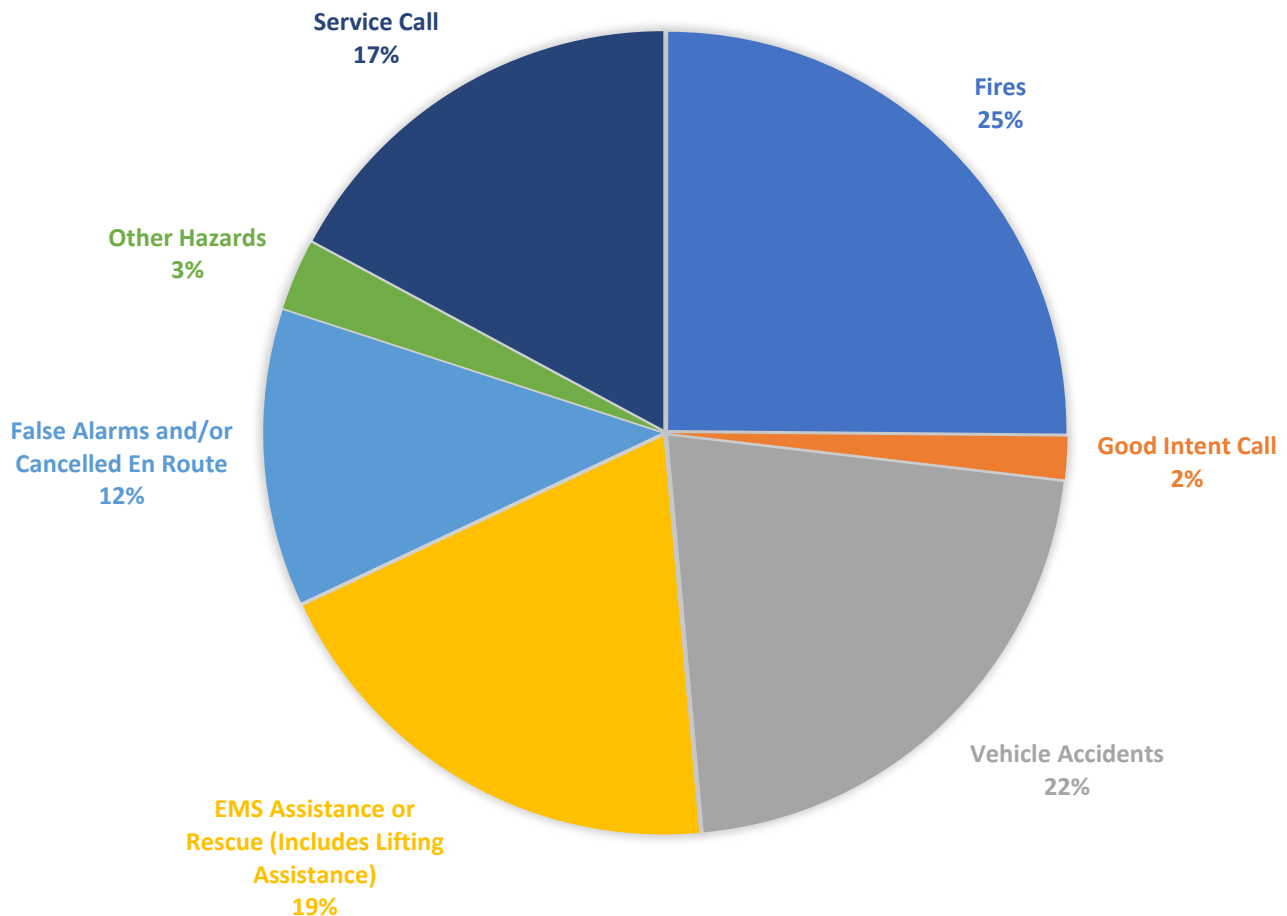


Incident Count and Percentage of Total Calls by Type for the year 2025

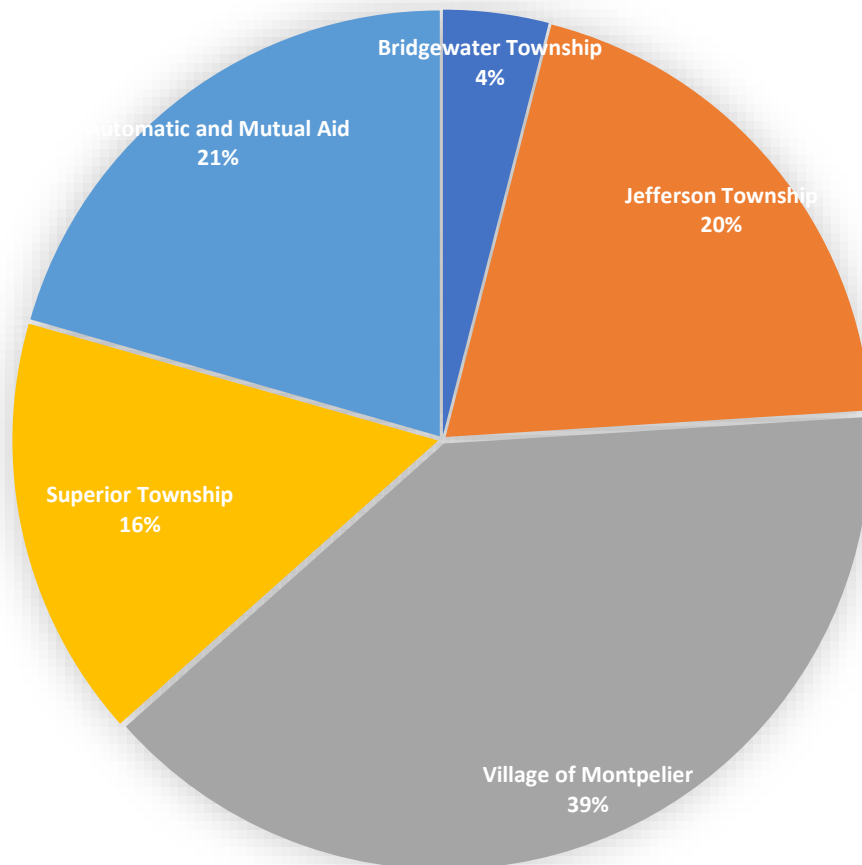

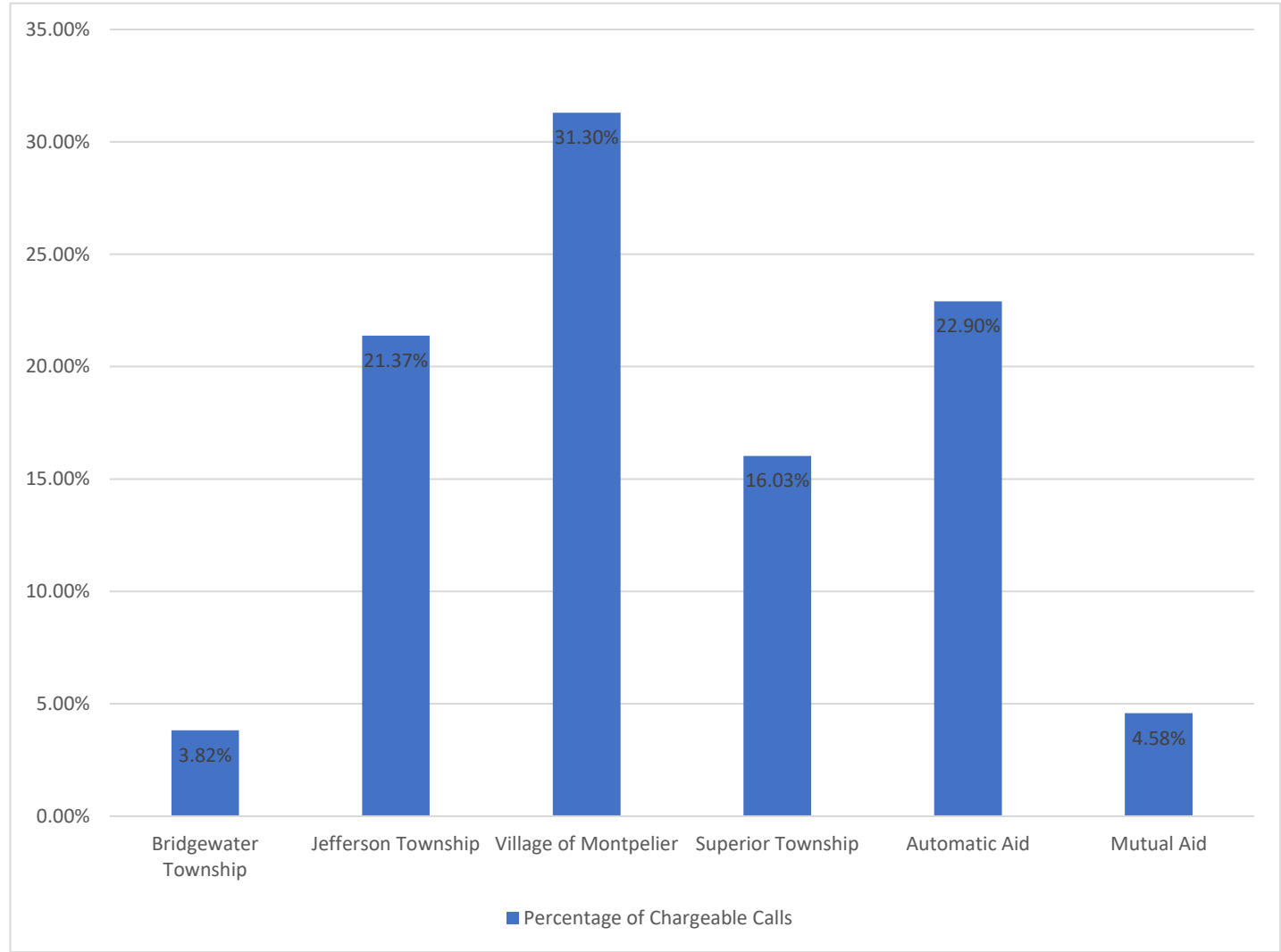

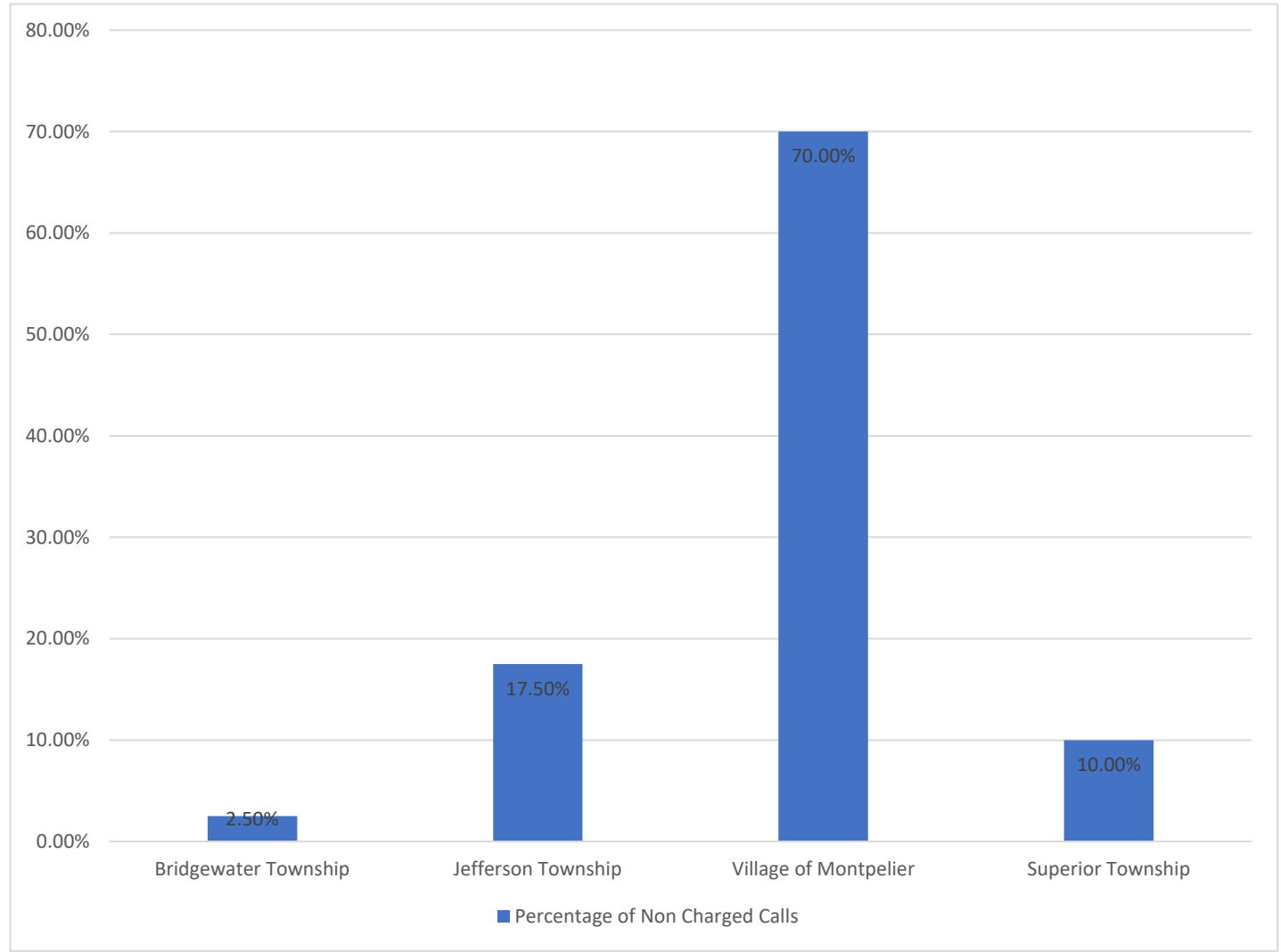

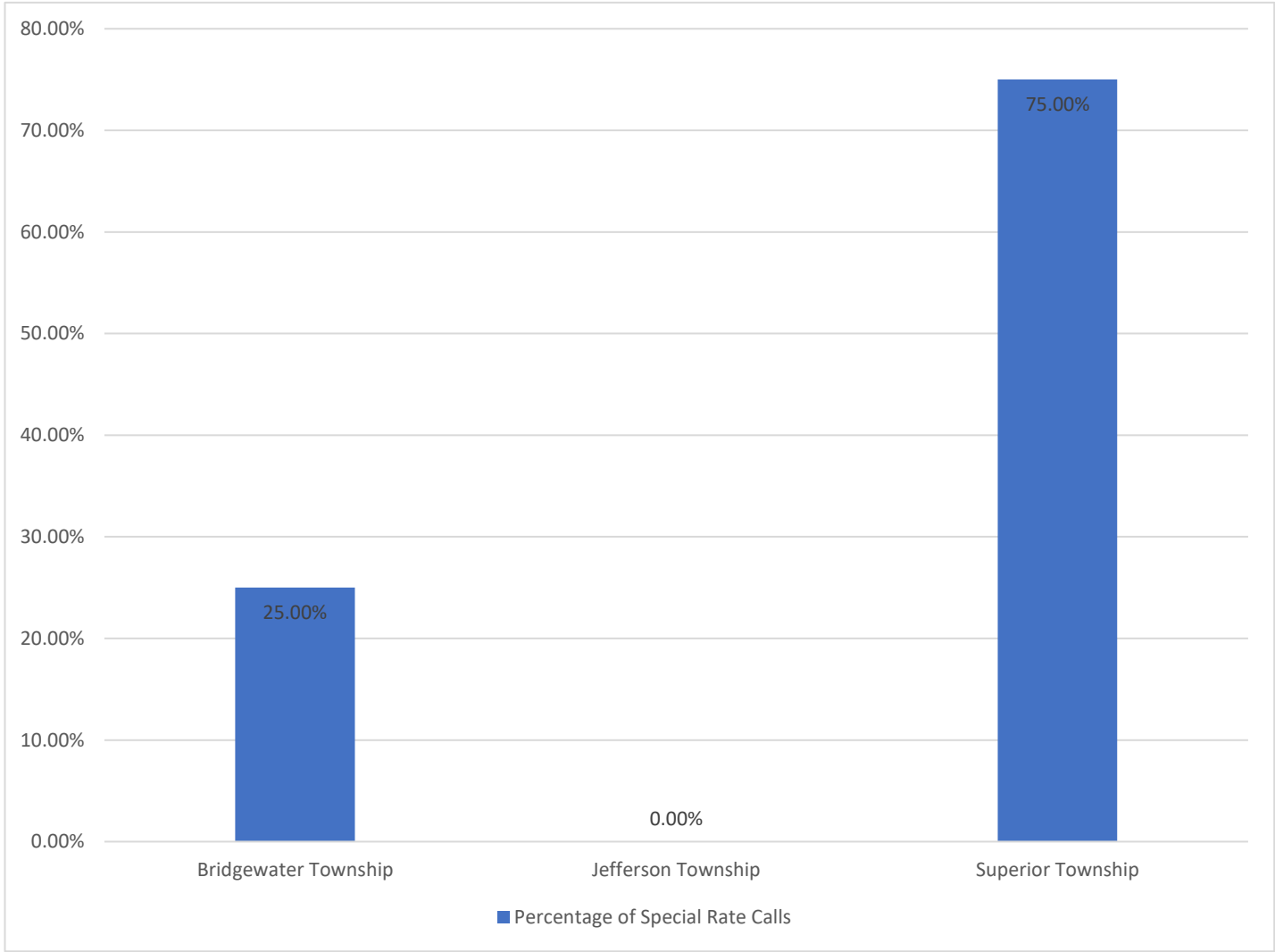

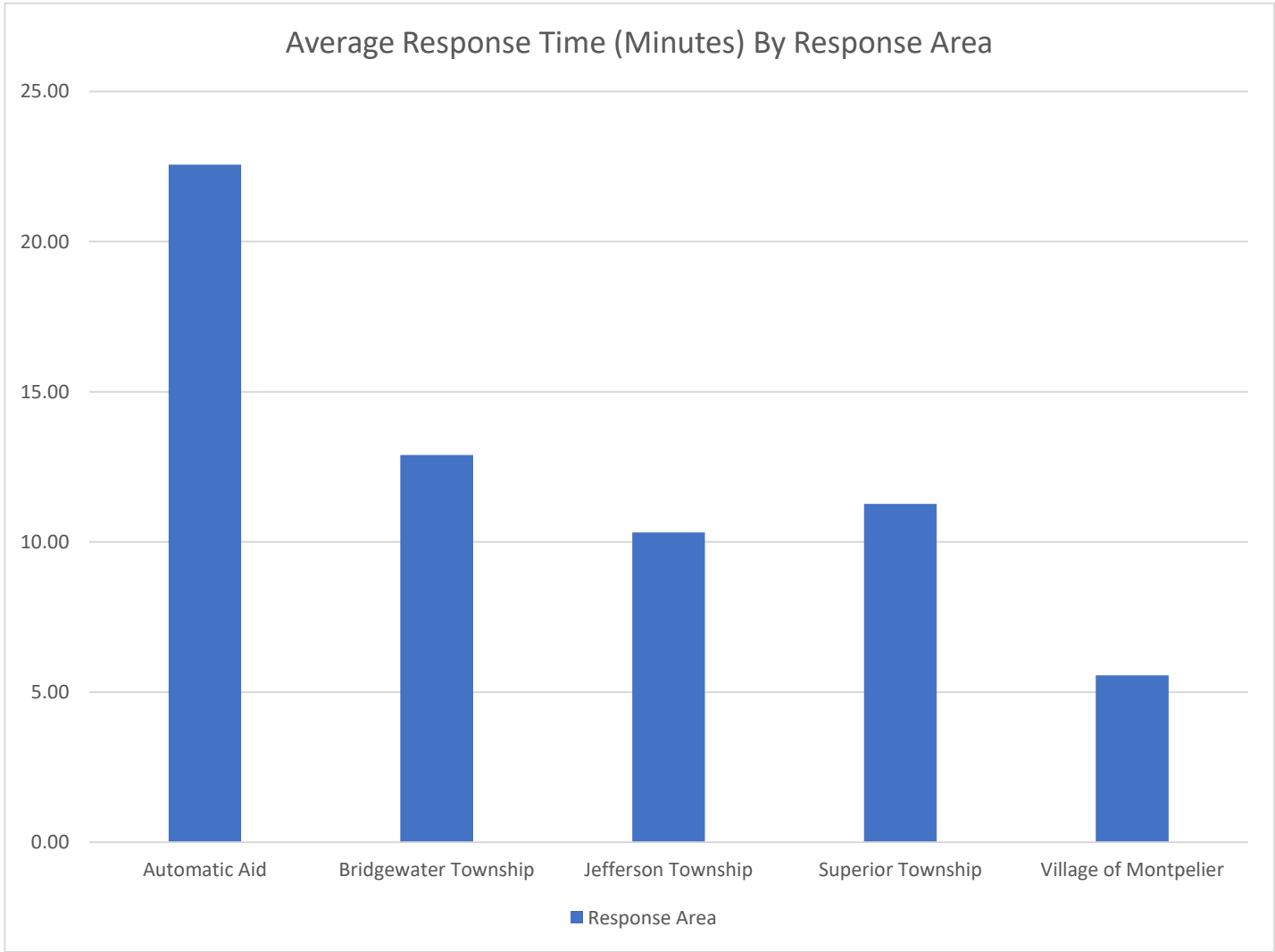

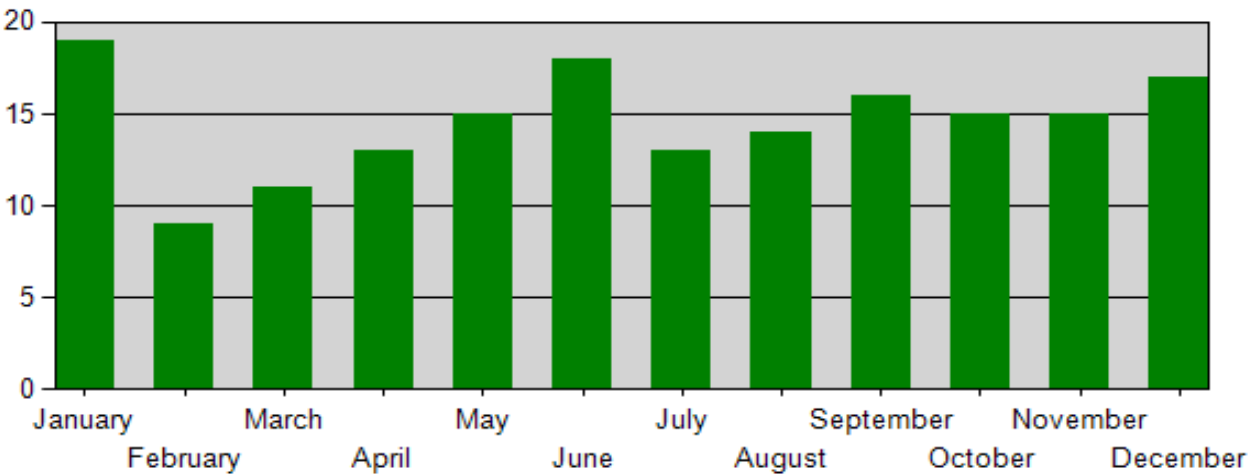

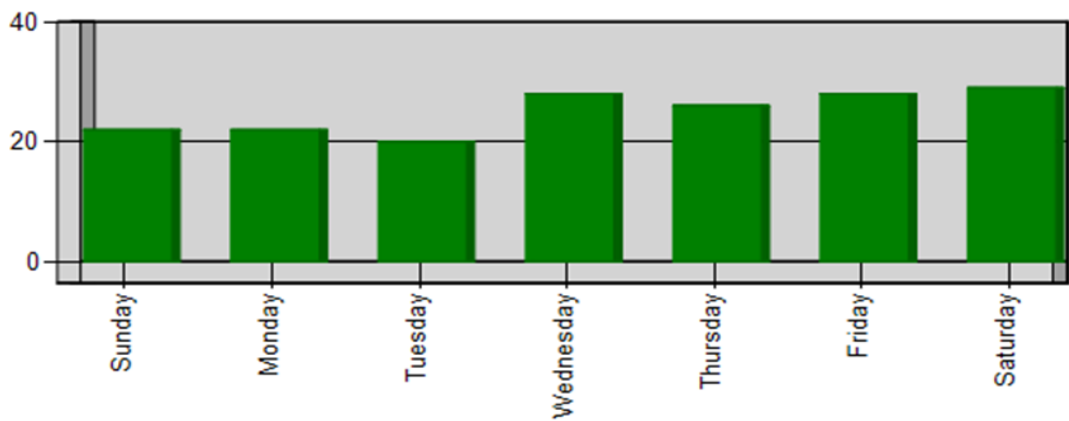

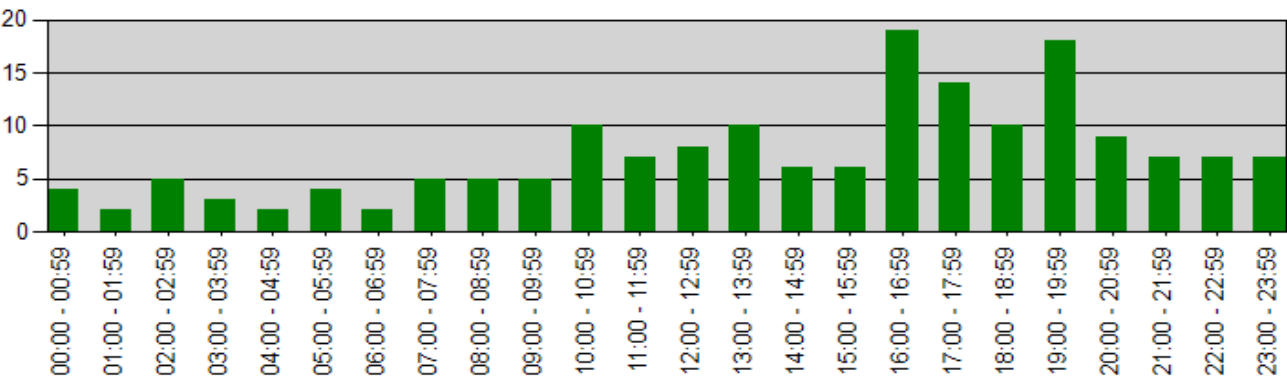
